HB 1106 - Clean Energy Jobs - Renewable Energy Portfolio Standard Revisions – Veto Override
Altering the renewable energy portfolio standard percentage derived from solar energy for specified years; altering the renewable energy portfolio standard percentage derived from Tier 1 renewable sources for specified years; authorizing the Small, Minority, and Women-Owned Businesses Account to receive money from the Strategic Energy Investment Fund; requiring the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation to study the workforce development training needs for the clean energy industry in the State; etc.

HB-0059 - Department of Economic Competitiveness and Commerce - Renaming and Reorganization

Renaming the Department of Economic Competitiveness and Commerce to be the Department of Commerce; repealing the Office of the Secretary of Commerce in the Office of the Governor; repealing the requirement that the Secretary of Commerce employ an Executive Director of the Department; repealing the qualifications and the duties of the Executive Director; providing that the Department of Commerce is the successor of the Department of Economic Competitiveness and Commerce; etc.

Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB84 - State Government - Office of Legislative Audits - Alterations in Audit Requirements

Altering the time period during which the Office of Legislative Audits and the Legislative Auditor are required to audit specified State funds, programs, authorities, units, and a specified local liquor board; requiring the audit of each unit of State government to be conducted at an interval ranging from 3 to 4 years unless the Legislative Auditor determines, on a per case basis, that more frequent audits are required; etc.

Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB0122 - Critical Area Commission for the Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays - Membership From Ocean City

Authorizing the Mayor of Ocean City to appoint a designee of the Mayor as a member of the Critical Area Commission for the Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays; and establishing that a member from the Atlantic Coastal Bays Watershed who is the Mayor of Ocean City or the designee of the Mayor is not subject to the advice and consent of the Senate.

Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB0169 - Carroll County - Turkey Hunting on Private Property - Sundays

Authorizing a person to hunt turkey on private property on Sundays during the spring turkey hunting season in Carroll County; and making the Act an emergency measure.

Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB0190 - Civil Remedies for Shoplifting and Employee Theft

Repealing a specified provision of law providing that a responsible person is civilly liable to a merchant for specified civil penalties for shoplifting and employee theft; altering requirements for specified demand letters relating to alleged acts of shoplifting or employee theft; providing that a responsible person who prevails in a specified civil action is entitled to an award of court costs and reasonable attorney's fees, under specified circumstances; etc.

Veto Sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB0194 - Carroll County - State's Attorney's Office and Child Support Enforcement Administration - Transfer of Personnel

Transferring the Child Support Unit of the Office of the State's Attorney for Carroll County to the Child Support Enforcement Administration of the Department of Human Resources; requiring that the employees be transferred in accordance with provisions of law; requiring that specified transferred employees be given credit with the State for years of county employment for purposes of determining specified retirement eligibility and also be subject to specified benefit selections in the Employees' Pension System; etc.

Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB0262 - Senior Citizen Activities Center Operating Fund - Distributions - Alteration

Increasing the amount of funding required to be included in the annual State budget for the Senior Citizen Activities Center Operating Fund to \$750,000; requiring that \$400,000 of the Fund be distributed to counties based on each county's share of the senior citizen population; providing a minimum distribution of \$5,000 per county; and requiring \$250,000 of the Fund be distributed to distressed counties in a specified manner.

Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB0272 - Anne Arundel County - Property Tax Credit - Benefit Corporations and Benefit Limited Liability Companies

Authorizing the governing body of Anne Arundel County or of a municipal corporation in Anne Arundel County to grant, by law, a tax credit against the county or municipal corporation property tax imposed on property owned or leased by a benefit corporation or benefit limited liability company, property that is not used for residential purposes, and property used in a trade or business by a benefit corporation or benefit limited liability company; etc.

Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB0299 - Worcester County - Alcoholic Beverages - Refillable Container Permit for Draft Beer

Establishing a refillable container permit for draft beer in Worcester County; authorizing the Worcester County Board of License Commissioners to issue a refillable container permit for draft beer to holders of a Class B or a Class D license; requiring licensees to complete the form provided by the Board and pay an annual permit fee of \$500; providing that the hours of sale for the permit begin at the same time as those for the underlying license and end at midnight; etc.

Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB0355 - Income Tax Subtraction Modification - College Savings Plans – Contributions
Providing a subtraction modification under the Maryland income tax for contributions made by specified individuals to specified college savings accounts subject to specified limitations; defining specified terms; and applying the Act to all taxable years beginning after December 31, 2015.
Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB0374 - Criminal Law - Pretrial Release - Prior Crimes
Prohibiting a District Court commissioner from authorizing the pretrial release of a defendant charged with a crime of violence if the defendant has previously been convicted of a specified crime; and prohibiting a District Court commissioner from authorizing release of a defendant charged with a specified crime if the defendant has previously been convicted of a crime of violence
Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB0379 - Employees' and Teachers' Pension Systems - Alternate Contributory Pension Selection and Reformed Contributory Pension Benefit
Repealing the June 30, 2016, date by which individuals who were subject to the Alternate Contributory Pension Selection in the Employee's Pension System or Teachers' Pension System before separating from employment must resume employment in order to resume participation in the Alternate Contributory Pension Selection; requiring the Board of Trustees to submit a report by October 1 annually, to the Joint Committee on Pensions providing the number of specified members in specified circumstances; etc
Veto sustained (0-135), McKay voted nay

HB380 - State Retirement and Pension System - Local Fire and Police System - Commingling of Assets
Repealing obsolete language authorizing the commingling of Local Fire and Police System assets with other State Retirement and Pension System assets; etc
Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB0381 - State Retirement and Pension System - Board of Trustees - Designee Appointments and Fiduciary Duties
Authorizing the Secretary of Budget and Management, the State Comptroller, and the State Treasurer to each appoint their respective deputies to serve as designees on the Board of Trustees for the State Retirement and Pension System; and altering a specified defined term to provide for specified fiduciary duties of members of specified committees established by the Board.
Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB0382 - State Retirement and Pension System - Optional Retirement Allowances - Designated Beneficiaries
Repealing as redundant specified provisions relating to members of the Judges' Retirement System designating multiple beneficiaries under a specified optional retirement allowance in the State Retirement and Pension System; clarifying that specified members of the State Retirement and Pension System may designate multiple beneficiaries under specified optional retirement allowances.
Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB0445 - Food Stamp Program - Minimum Benefit - State Supplement
Requiring the State to provide a supplement to increase the total benefit to \$30 per month to a household that includes an individual who is at least 62 years old and receives a federally funded benefit in an amount less than \$30 per month under the food stamp program.

Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB0451 - Admissions and Amusement Tax - Revenue Distribution - Maryland State Arts Council
Altering a distribution of revenue from the State admissions and amusement tax on electronic bingo and electronic tip jars to provide up to an aggregate amount of \$1,000,000 in each fiscal year to the Special Fund for Preservation of Cultural Arts in Maryland; providing that the Maryland State Arts Council is entitled to a specified revenue distribution from the State admissions and amusement tax; requiring that the funds distributed to the Council be included in the Council's prior fiscal year appropriations; etc.

Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB0460 - Housing and Community Development - Community Development Administration - Student and Residential Mortgage Loan

Authorizing the Community Development Administration in the Department of Housing and Community Development to make, participate in making, and undertake a commitment for financial assistance to a homeowner for purchasing a homeowner's primary residence and making payments on the homeowner's student loan debt under specified circumstances; requiring the Secretary of Housing and Community Development to determine the terms and qualifications of specified financial assistance to homeowners; etc.

Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB0537 - Teachers' Retirement and Pension Systems - Reemployment of Retirees - Clarification
Clarifying the number of retirees of the Teachers' Retirement System or the Teachers' Pension System that are exempt from a specified offset of a retirement allowance if they are reemployed in specified positions in a local school system or the Maryland School for the Deaf.

Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB0543 - Allegany County - Alcoholic Beverages - Minimum Age to Serve Liquor
Decreasing in Allegany County the minimum age for an individual to serve liquor from 21 years to 18 years.

Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB0550 - Distillery License Holders - Sale of Product to Participants in Guided Tour
Repealing a specified provision of law that limits a distillery license holder to selling product and related merchandise to an individual on a guided tour only if the license holder manufactures not more than 27,500 gallons of products annually.

Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB0575 - Portable Electronics Insurance - Required Notices - Method of Mailing
Altering the method of mailing that an insurer or a vendor is required to use when the insurer or vendor sends to a policyholder or covered customer specified notices about a termination or any other change in the terms and conditions of a policy of portable electronics insurance.

Veto sustained (0-135) McKay voted nay

HB0577 - Allegany County and Garrett County - Annual Financial Reports - Filing Date
Providing that Allegany County and Garrett County are required to file annual financial reports with the Department of Legislative Services on or before December 31 after the close of the county's fiscal year.

Veto sustain (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB0581 - State Retirement and Pension System - Reemployment of Ordinary Disability Retirees - Earnings Limitation

Exempting from a specified reemployment earnings limitation specified disability retirees whose average final compensation was less than \$25,000 and who are reemployed while receiving an ordinary disability retirement allowance from the State Retirement and Pension System

Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB0582 – Correctional Officers’ Retirement System – Clifton T. Perkins Maximum Security Guards – Allowance

Altering the age at which a normal service retirement allowance begins for a member of the Correctional Officers' Retirement System who is a maximum security attendant at the Clifton T. Perkins Hospital Center; altering the age at which a vested allowance begins for specified members of the Correctional Officers' Retirement System who serve as maximum security attendants at the Clifton T. Perkins Hospital Center; and applying the Act only prospectively to an individual who retires on or after July 1, 2016; etc.

Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB0610 – Greenhouse Gas Emission Reductions Act – Reauthorized

Repealing the termination date for a provision of law requiring the State to reduce statewide greenhouse gas emissions by 25% from 2006 levels by 2020; requiring the State to reduce statewide greenhouse gas emissions by 40% from 2006 levels by 2030; requiring the Department of the Environment to submit specified plans to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before specified dates; requiring the Maryland Commission on Climate Change to oversee a study of the economic impact of requiring specified reductions from the manufacturing sector; etc.

Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB0689 - Procurement - Prevailing Wage - Liquidated Damages

Making a contractor under a public work contract that knew or reasonably should have known of the contractor's obligation to pay the prevailing wage rate and that deliberately failed or refused to pay the prevailing wage rate is liable to a public body for liquidated damages of \$250 for each laborer or other employee under specified circumstances.

Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB0717 - Dorchester County - Class B Beer, Wine, and Liquor License - Minimum Seating Requirement

Altering the minimum seating requirement from 50 to 25 individuals for facilities for which a specified Class B beer, wine, and liquor license may be issued in Dorchester County.

Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB0785 – Public Safety – Motorcycle Profiling – Training

Requiring the Police Training Commission to require a specified statement condemning motorcycle profiling to be included in existing written policies regarding other profiling; requiring the Commission to include in a specified curriculum and courses of study training on motorcycle profiling in conjunction with existing training regarding other profiling; and defining the term "motorcycle profiling".

Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB0805 - Motor Vehicles - Autocycles - Standards and Requirements

Establishing that an autocycle is considered to be a motorcycle for the purposes of the Maryland Vehicle Law; defining the term "autocycle" to include a motor vehicle manufactured in compliance with federal safety standards; prohibiting an applicant for a specified driver skills examination from using an autocycle for the examination; requiring that the form for specified written accident reports distinguish autocycles from motorcycles; etc.

Veto sustained (0-135); McKay vetoed nay

HB0867 - Washington County - Contributions to Nonprofit Organizations – Process

Altering the process by which the County Commissioners of Washington County make contributions to specified nonprofit organizations in Washington County; altering the deadline for submission of applications for contributions; requiring the County Commissioners to hold a public hearing on the applications; authorizing the County Commissioners to remove specified organizations from a specified list and, on request by the organization, to revise or amend the name of an organization; etc.

Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB0926 - Optional Retirement Program - Eligibility - Alterations

Altering the eligibility provisions of the Optional Retirement Program to include individuals in specified position categories designated by specified governing boards of institutions of higher education or the Secretary of Higher Education; requiring an individual who was a participant in the Optional Retirement Program as August 22, 2004, to continue to participate in the Program under specified circumstances; and conforming specified terminology to current institutional policies regarding employment categories.

Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB0972 - St. Mary's County - Local Licenses - Repeal

Repealing provisions of law that relate to specified licenses issued in St. Mary's County for hucksters, peddlers, and other specified businesses.

HB1095 - Education - Prekindergarten Programs - Notification of Eligibility by Local Departments of Social Services

Requiring specified local departments of social services and specified local health departments, under specified circumstances, to provide specified parents or guardians with an oral and written notice that their child may be eligible for publicly funded prekindergarten programs; requiring specified local departments of social services and specified local health departments to report annually to the General Assembly on the number of parents who were given a notification and who subsequently enrolled their child in the specified program; etc.

Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB1150 - Health Insurance - Consumer Health Claim Filing Fairness Act

Requiring a specified health benefit plan to include provisions that permit enrollees a minimum of 1 year to submit a claim for a service, provide for the suspension of the minimum period of time, and provide that failure to submit a claim within the minimum period of time does not invalidate or reduce the amount of the claim; creating an exception to a provision of law that requires proof of loss to be furnished to an insurer in case of claim for loss within a specified period of time; etc.

Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB1155 - Calvert County - Bonding Authority

Authorizing and empowering the County Commissioners of Calvert County, from time to time, to borrow not more than \$9,410,000 to finance the construction, improvement, or development of specified public facilities in Calvert County and to effect such borrowing by the issuance and sale of its general obligation bonds; etc.

Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB1352 - Wicomico County Board of Education - Election and Appointment of Members

Requiring that, beginning in 2018, members of the Wicomico County Board of Education be elected by districts and members be elected at large, as specified; providing that, alternatively, beginning in 2018, members of the Wicomico County Board of Education be elected by districts and members be appointed, as specified; establishing a School Board Nominating Commission; submitting the Act to a referendum of the qualified voters of Wicomico County; etc.

Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB1397 - Participating Governmental Units - Amortization Schedule

Altering the calculation of the accrued liability contributions required to be paid by a participating governmental unit on account of members of the Employees' Retirement System and Employees' Pension System who are employees of a participating governmental unit; and clarifying the application of a specified amortization period to specified legislative changes.

Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB1461 - Commercial Drivers' Licenses - Cancellations and Downgrades (Driving Privilege Preservation Act of 2016)

Requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration to cancel the commercial driver's license of an individual who fails to submit to the Administration a current certificate of physical examination; authorizing the Administration to immediately reinstate and, subject to specified conditions, issue a noncommercial driver's license of an appropriate class to an individual whose commercial driver's license is canceled as a result of the failure to submit a specified certificate of physical examination; etc.

Veto sustained (0-135); McKay voted nay

HB1463 - Coordinating Council for Juvenile Services Educational Programs - Membership
Altering the membership of the Coordinating Council for Juvenile Services Educational Programs; providing for the terms of office of the appointed members of the Coordinating Council; terminating on December 31, 2016, the term of the member of the Coordinating Council who is a county superintendent of schools; providing that the terms of specified appointed and ex officio members of the Coordinating Council shall begin on January 1, 2017; etc.

HB0005 - Private Passenger Motor Vehicle Liability Insurance - Enhanced Underinsured Motorist Coverage

Authorizing a specified insured to elect to obtain specified enhanced underinsured motorist coverage under a private passenger motor vehicle liability insurance policy; requiring specified insurers to offer an enhanced underinsured motorist coverage under specified circumstances; altering a specified prohibition on the recovery of benefits under specified coverages; applying the Act to each policy of private passenger motor vehicle insurance issued, sold, or delivered in the State on or after July 1, 2018; etc.

Passed 106-28; McKay voted nay;

HB0032 - Amusement Devices - Free-Play Pinball Machines - Use by Minors

Eliminating a requirement that prohibits a person who keeps a specified free-play pinball machine from allowing a minor to operate the machine.

Passes 135-0; McKay voted yea

HB0116 - Maryland Insurance Administration - Sunset Review - Required Reports and Repeal of Preliminary Evaluation Requirement

Repealing the requirement that the Maryland Insurance Administration, and the statutes and regulations that relate to the Administration, be subject to a preliminary evaluation in accordance with the provisions of the Maryland Program Evaluation Act (Sunset Law); requiring the Administration to submit specified reports to specified committees of the General Assembly and the Department of Legislative Services at specified times; etc.

Passes 134-0; McKay voted yea

HB0136 - Insurance - Public Adjusters

Altering specified provisions concerning the licensing and practice of public adjusters; adding and altering specified definitions relating to public adjusters; providing an exception to licensing for specified marketing activities; repealing the requirement that public adjuster license application forms include specified employment disclosures; repealing the requirement for specified experience before taking a specified written examination; applying the Act to all public adjuster licenses issued or renewed on or after January 1, 2018; etc.

HB0074 - Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2014 - Baltimore County - Chesapeake High Stadium

Amending the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2014 to remove the matching fund requirement for specified grants for Chesapeake High Stadium.

Passed 137-0; McKay voted yay

HB0076 – Baltimore City Public Schools - Capital Project Scoring System

Requiring the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners, by January 1, 2018, to develop and implement a scoring system for evaluating specified public school projects and, on or before January 1, 2020, to apply the scoring system to 75% of specified public school facilities, publish project scores on the Baltimore City Public School's Web site, and report project scores to the General Assembly; requiring the Board, by January 1, 2021, to apply the scoring system to the remaining 25% of public school facilities; etc.

Passed 139-0; McKay voted yay

HB0078 - State Government - Maryland Manual - Revisions (Maryland Manual Modernization Act)

Altering specified provisions of law to require the State Archives to compile, edit, and publish an online Maryland Manual that describes the State, its government, federal officials and agencies directly related to the State; requiring, as provided in the State budget, the State Archives to update the Maryland Manual to maintain its accuracy and to annually preserve a version that contains changes made in the preceding year; encouraging the Archivist to reach out to specified entities regarding the availability of the Maryland Manual; etc.

Passed 131-0; McKay voted yay

HB0115 - Mold Remediation Services Providers - Licensure and Program Evaluation

Allowing the Maryland Mold Remediation Services Act to terminate on July 1, 2019 in accordance with provisions of the Maryland Program Evaluation Act (sunset law); extending to July 1, 2019 the deadline for licensure under the Maryland Mold Remediation Services Act.

Passed 132-0; McKay voted yay

HB0117 - Elevator Safety Review Board - Sunset Extension, Program Evaluation, and Reporting Requirement

Continuing the Elevator Safety Review Board in accordance with the provisions of the Maryland Program Evaluation Act (sunset law) by extending to July 1, 2029, the termination provisions relating to the statutory and regulatory authority of the Board; requiring that an evaluation of the Board and the statutes and regulations that govern the Board be performed on or before a specified date; requiring the Board to study, make recommendations, and report its findings on specified matters on or before October 1, 2018; etc.

Passed 131, McKay voted yay

HB0140 - State Commission of Real Estate Appraisers, Appraisal Management Companies, and Home Inspectors - Supervision of Appraiser Trainees

Altering the qualifications for a real estate appraisal license and for a certificate for residential or general real estate appraisal to require that the applicant provide real estate appraiser services as a trainee under the supervision of only a certified appraiser.

Passed 132-0; McKay voted yay

HB0148 - State Archives - Care of Fine Art or Decorative Art - Procurement Exemption

Exempting the preservation, conservation, proper care, restoration, and transportation by the State Archives of art, in the custody of the Commission on Artistic Property and owned by or loaned to the State, from specified provisions of State procurement law.

Passed 131-1; McKay voted yay

HB0159 - Weapon-Free Higher Education Zones

Altering a specified exception relating to law enforcement officers to the prohibition on carrying specified weapons on public school property; prohibiting the carrying or possession of specified firearms on the property of public institutions of higher education; requiring a public institution of higher education to post specified signs in prominent locations on the property; requiring the Board of Regents of the University System of Maryland to incorporate into their bylaws, policies and procedures, the current weapons practice on campus; etc.

Passed 89-49; McKay voted nay

HB0180 - Department of Health and Mental Hygiene - Renaming

Renaming the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to be the Maryland Department of Health; renaming the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene to be the Secretary of Health; providing that the Maryland Department of Health is the successor of the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene; providing that specified names and titles of a specified unit and officials in laws and other documents mean the names and titles of the successor unit and officials; etc

Passed 139-0; McKay voted yay

HB0198 - Junk Dealers and Scrap Metal Processors - Cell Tower Batteries - Required Record
Altering the definition of junk or scrap metal to include cell tower batteries; and requiring a junk dealer or scrap metal processor to keep a specified accurate record of each purchase of a cell tower battery in the State.

Passed 133-0; McKay voted yay

HB0207 - St. Mary's County - Local Plumbing Code – Repeal
Repealing a provision of law related to the adoption of a plumbing code in St. Mary's County.

Passed 133-0; McKay voted yay

HB0208 - St. Mary's County - Electricians and Board of Electrical Examiners - Repeal

Passed 133-0; McKay voted yay

HB0291 - Homeowner's Insurance - Notices

Authorizing specified notices and statements relating to homeowner's insurance to be delivered by electronic means if the insurer complies with specified requirements; authorizing insurers to comply with specified renewal notice requirements relating to homeowner's insurance by sending a specified notice; requiring the Maryland Insurance Commissioner to adopt by regulation a specified notice to be provided to insureds and policyholders at each renewal that contains specified information; etc.

Passed 133-0; McKay voted yay

HJ0003 - Attorney General - Powers - Maryland Defense Act of 2017

Directing the Attorney General to take specified actions regarding civil and criminal suits and actions that are based on the federal government's action or inaction that threatens the public interest and welfare of the residents of the State; requiring the Attorney General, except under specified circumstances, to provide the Governor with specified notice and an opportunity to review and comment on specified suits and actions before commencing specified suits and actions; etc.

Passed 89-50; McKay voted nay

Thursday, February 16th, 2017

HB0011 - Vehicle Laws - Causing Diesel Emissions to Discharge Onto Another - Prohibition
Prohibiting a person from causing a diesel-powered motor vehicle to emit clearly visible smoke, soot, or other exhaust emissions onto another person or motor vehicle; and providing for the application of the Act.

Passed 94-30; McKay voted nay

HB0023 - Vehicle Laws - School Vehicles - Definition

Altering the definition of "school vehicle" to include specified vehicles that meet or comply with specified standards and requirements, were originally titled and used to transport children, students, and teachers in another state, comply with the regulations on transporting children enrolled in the federally funded Head Start Program, and are used only for transporting children to and from a Head Start program.

Passed 127-0; McKay voted yay

HB0026 - Real Property - Notices of Foreclosure Sale and Postponement or Cancellation of Foreclosure Sale

Requiring the person authorized to make a foreclosure sale to give written notice of the proposed sale to a specified condominium or homeowners association that, at least 30 days before the date of the proposed sale, has recorded a statement of lien against the property; requiring the trustee, within 14 days after the postponement or cancellation of a foreclosure sale, to send a notice that the sale

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was postponed or canceled to the record owner; applying the Act to a foreclosure sale scheduled after the effective date of the Act; etc.

Passed 130-0; McKay voted yay, Wivell voted yay

HB0034 - Real Property - Homeowners Associations - Resale of Lot - Inspection Fees

Authorizing a homeowners association to charge a reasonable fee not to exceed \$100 for an inspection of a lot owner's lot as part of the homeowners association's preparation of required disclosures on resale of the lot under specified circumstances.

Passed 85-441 McKay voted nay

HB0044 - Residential Property - Ground Lease Registration Forms - Contact Information Option
Requiring the ground lease registration form required by the State Department of Assessments and Taxation to include a section that allows the ground lease holder to include a telephone number and e-mail address; and requiring the reporting form for changes or corrections required by the State Department of Assessments and Taxation to include a section that provides the ground lease holder the option to provide the ground lease holder's telephone number and e-mail address.

Passed 131-1; McKay voted yay

HB0051 - Vehicle Laws - Electric Personal Assistive Mobility Device - Definition

Altering the definition of "electric personal assistive mobility device" to require that the device have a specified steering mechanism and a specified platform on which the rider stands.

Passed 133-0; McKay voted yay

HB0126 - Natural Resources - Wildlife and Hunting

Clarifying the authorized uses of the State Wildlife Management and Protection Fund; repealing specified requirements that the Department of Natural Resources use specified funds from specified hunting license sales for specified purposes; requiring a person who harvests a game bird or mammal to report the harvest in accordance with specified regulations; requiring a person who possesses a game bird or mammal killed by means other than hunting to report the possession in accordance with specified regulations; etc.

Passed 134-1; McKay voted yay

HB0062 - State Retirement and Pension System - Disability Retirement - Reemployment Earnings Limitation

Altering the amount used in a calculation to determine whether retirees receiving an ordinary disability retirement allowance from the State Retirement and Pension System are subject to a specified reemployment earnings limitation.

Passed 135-0; McKay voted yay

HB0201 - Employees' and Teachers' Pension Systems - Reformed Contributory Pension Benefit - Service Credit Purchase Clarification

Clarifying that a member of the Employees' Pension System or the Teachers' Pension System who is subject to the Reformed Contributory Pension Benefit is eligible to purchase service credit for a specified period of employment under specified circumstances.

Passed 135-0; McKay voted yay

HB0202 - State Retirement and Pension System - Authority to Arrange Custody of Investments and Procurement Exemption

Exempting from specified procurement law expenditures made by the Board of Trustees for the State Retirement and Pension System for the safe custody of investments of the State Retirement and Pension System; and transferring the authority to arrange for the safe custody of investments from the State Treasurer to the Board of Trustees; and applying the Act prospectively.

Passed 135-0; McKay voted yay

HB0212 - Consumer Protection - Credit Report Security Freezes - Prohibition on Fees and Required Notices

Prohibiting a consumer reporting agency from charging a consumer a fee for placing a security freeze, or for the first two temporary lifts of a security freeze in a calendar year, if the consumer has received a notice of a breach of the security of a system under specified provisions of State law or from or on behalf of a federal agency and provides a copy of the notice to the consumer reporting agency; etc.

Passed 87-49; McKay voted nay

HB0258 - Adult Entertainment Establishments - National Human Trafficking Resource Center Hotline Information - Sign Posting Requirements

Requiring the owner of an adult entertainment establishment to post the National Human Trafficking Resource Center Hotline information sign in each restroom of the adult entertainment establishment in a specified manner; requiring a specified agency that determines a specified violation has occurred to notify the owner of the adult entertainment establishment or the owner's agent of the violation; providing a maximum civil penalty of \$1,000 for each restroom without the specified notification; etc.

Passed 135-0; McKay voted yay

HB0261 - Public Utilities - Termination of Service to Multifamily Dwelling Unit - Notification to Property Owner or Property Manager

Requiring a public service company that is going to terminate, because of nonpayment, electric or gas service to a customer who resides in a multifamily dwelling unit to notify the property owner or property manager before terminating service if the property owner or property manager has enrolled in a third-party termination notification program; requiring a specified property owner or property manager to obtain written consent from a customer in order to enroll in a third-party notification program; etc.

Passed 136-0; McKay voted yay

HB0451 - Insurance - Bail Bondsmen - Continuing Education Requirements

Requiring insurance producers who sell, solicit, or negotiate bail bonds to receive continuing education that directly relates to bail bond insurance.

Passed 133-3; McKay voted yay

HB0511 - Public Utilities - Water Companies and Sewage Disposal Companies - Rate Cases and Proceedings

Authorizing the technical staff of the Public Service Commission to assist a water company or a sewage disposal company in establishing a proposed just and reasonable rate; authorizing the technical staff to seek information from specified companies under specified circumstances; requiring the Commission to restrict the availability of specified staff-assisted rate cases to companies who gross annual revenue for a specified time period are below an amount determined by the Commission, not to exceed \$1,000,000; etc.

Passed 137-0; McKay voted yay

HB0128 - State Disabilities Plan and Interagency Disabilities Board - Revisions

Altering the date, from October 1 to December 1 of each year, by which the Secretary of Disabilities must submit an annual analysis of the State's progress in implementing the State Disabilities Plan and related performance objectives to the Governor and the General Assembly; altering the membership of the Interagency Disabilities Board; and altering the required elements of the State Disabilities Plan.

Passed 135-0; McKay voted yay

HB0132 - Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program - Regulations

Requiring the Secretary of Aging to consult with the State Long-Term Care Ombudsman when adopting specified regulations that relate to the Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program, including specified annual reviews, resident councils and family councils in long-term care facilities, training and designating ombudsmen, conflicts of interest, and confidentiality of specified information and documents

Passed 134-0; McKay voted yay

HB0146 - Secretary of Aging - Administration of Commodity Supplemental Food Program and Regulatory Authority

Requiring the Secretary of Aging to administer the federal Commodity Supplemental Food Program using specified funds and resources received from the United States Department of Agriculture in accordance with a specified law; and authorizing the Secretary to adopt specified regulations.

Passed 135-0; McKay voted yay

HBB0147 - Healthy Aging Program

Establishing the Healthy Aging Program in the Department of Aging; specifying the purposes of the Program; providing that funding for the Program shall be as provided in the State budget; authorizing the Secretary of Aging to accept money from specified sources for the Program; authorizing the Secretary to adopt regulations to implement the Program; etc.

Passed 134-1

HB0165 - State Government - Maryland Uniform Electronic Legal Materials Act

Requiring an official publisher that publishes legal material in an electronic record to designate the electronic record as official, under specified circumstances, and authenticate the electronic record in a specified manner; providing that specified legal material in an electronic record is presumed to be an accurate copy; requiring an official publisher of specified legal material in an electronic record to provide for the preservation and security of the record and to ensure that it is reasonably available to the public; etc.

Passed 135-0; McKay voted yay
